Day 2: Jerash and the Amman Children's Museum

Today, we leave Amman and explore the vast Roman ruins at Jerash, renowned for being some of the best-preserved in the entire Middle East. After a light lunch, we return to Amman to visit the engaging and interactive Children's Museum. The museum features sections dedicated to the human body, ancient civilisations, astronomy, optical illusions, and various flight simulators incorporated into child-sized planes, hot air balloons, pedal planes, and more. There are also outdoor exhibits, making it an enjoyable spot for children of all ages. It's a great opportunity for them to experience the types of museums and activities that are offered to local Jordanian children.

Day 3: Journey Along the King's Highway to Petra

Leaving Amman, we head south along the King's Highway, widely regarded as one of the most picturesque routes in the Middle East. This journey takes the whole day, but we will pause frequently for various stops along the way. These include a visit to the Roman mosaics in Madaba, a chance to stretch our legs amidst the vast canyon and olive groves of Wadi Mujib, and time to discover the towering walls and intricate tunnels of the magnificent crusader castle at Kerak

(remember to bring a torch, as the tunnels and halls offer an exciting exploration for children). We conclude the day at our hotel, located near the iconic site of Petra.

Day 4: A Day in Petra

The key highlight of today's tour is the exploration of the captivating, secret Nabatean city of Petra. It's an excellent destination for children, with its dramatic landscapes, fascinating history of rediscovery, and many paths and steps to enjoy. A 2-3 hour guided tour is included, along with lunch and ample free time to visit the High Place of Sacrifice and the Monastery, should you wish to, and if your children have the energy for it.

Day 5: Wadi Rum Adventure: Jeep Safari, Camel Ride at Sunset, and Bedouin Camp

Today, we venture back into the desert, travelling by 4x4 jeep through the breathtaking high cliffs and sand dunes of Wadi Rum. Upon reaching a Bedouin camp nestled beneath the cliffs, deep within the desert reserve, we'll check in and enjoy lunch. In the afternoon, we embark on a jeep safari to explore the desert's cliffs, dunes, and some fascinating and unusual rock formations. As the evening approaches, we'll have a memorable camel ride at sunset, followed by a traditional Bedouin meal shared with our hosts. The night will be spent at the camp, where comfortable beds and bedding are provided. However, if you prefer, you may opt to sleep under the stars (please bring a sleeping bag).

Day 6: Leisure Time in Aqaba by the Red Sea

Today, the tour takes a more leisurely pace as we embark on a brief drive after breakfast to Aqaba. The remainder of the day is yours to enjoy at your leisure, either relaxing on the beach or by the pool at a beach resort. There is also an optional boat trip into the Red Sea, offering the chance to snorkel around one of the nearby islands. Alternatively, glass-bottom boat rides are available for a different experience.

Day 7: Drive to Amman through the Dead Sea

After a brief final morning swim, we head north once more today, driving through the Jordan Valley towards Amman. As we pass expansive salt flats at the southern tip of the Dead Sea, we follow the coastline northwards, with Israel visible across the water to the west and stunning mountain landscapes and canyons rising sharply from the road to the east. Along the way, we will stop for a swim in the unique, highly saline waters of the Dead Sea. This swim is unlike any other; due to the extreme salinity, regular swimming isn't possible, and it's much easier (and more photogenic!) to float, whether sitting or lying in the water. Take care to avoid getting water in your eyes, as it can sting. Towels and showers are available, and you can also enjoy a fun mud bath here. The evening is free for a final farewell dinner in Amman.

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Wadi Mujib Day Trip - Siq Trail

Escape the hustle and bustle of Amman and embark on a true adventure, exploring the magnificent canyons of Wadi Mujib via the renowned Siq Trail.

We'll depart from Amman and journey approximately 90 minutes to the shores of the Dead Sea, where our trek along the Siq Trail commences at the Wadi Mujib visitor centre. Descending into the gorge, we'll enter the Wadi Mujib Nature Reserve. Between April and October, this reserve offers an exhilarating hike through the shallow waters that fill the canyon. Along the way, you'll ascend small waterfalls, aided by conveniently installed steps, until you reach the end of the gorge, where you can relax and rejuvenate beneath a cascading waterfall. The entire hike typically takes 2 to 3 hours to complete.

We highly recommend bringing a dry bag to protect your camera or mobile phone from the water, as well as water shoes for comfortable trekking. Dry bags can be hired at the visitor centre for approximately US\$7.00, and water shoes can be purchased for the same price.

Please note that for most tours, an extra night's accommodation pre- or post-tour will be necessary to allow sufficient time for this

excursion. However, if your departure flight is scheduled for late on your final day, it may be possible to visit Wadi Mujib on your departure day.

This option adds on a fun sunset or sunrise camel ride through the Wadi Rum desert.

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1. Accommodation

On this tour, we select high-quality hotels that are locally rated as 3 to 4 stars, with the Petra hotel being more boutique in style and considered to be a solid 3 to 4-star option. You will also spend a night in a cosy Bedouin camp within the Wadi Rum desert reserve. The accommodation here consists of en-suite tents, complete with bedding and all necessary facilities.

This tour can be organised privately, with the option to adjust hotel standards, styles, and options to match your preferences and budget. For examples of typical hotels used on the tour, please refer to the accommodation tab. Should you have any special accommodation requests, feel free to let us know, and we will be happy to offer a personalised quotation.

We offer twin, double, and triple rooms, as well as family suites. Extra beds or mattresses can be added to some rooms for younger children. Some hotels also offer connecting rooms, though these cannot always be guaranteed in advance, as availability depends on bookings made on previous days. Please get in touch with us if you have any questions regarding rooming arrangements for your family.

2. Group Size / Tour Leaders / Guides

We are dedicated to operating as a small group provider, believing this format offers both adults and children the ideal opportunity to connect with their fellow travellers and engage more effectively with their guide. Therefore, on our Family tours, we will never place you on a large coach packed with other passengers and a single guide. A smaller group size also enables us to offer unique activities that would be difficult to organise for larger groups.

This tour has a minimum group size of 3 and a maximum of 16.

To accompany you during the tour, we provide a fully trained, English-speaking local tour leader/driver, along with specialist guides in Jerash, Amman, and Petra. Groups of 5 or more will have both a driver and a professional guide for the entire trip.

At Egypt Uncovered, we exclusively use local Jordanian guides and representatives. We believe this enhances your experience of both the country and the sites you are visiting.

3. Dates & Prices

We offer regular small-group departures for this tour throughout the year, typically coinciding with school holiday periods. Each departure is guaranteed to operate with a minimum of 3 travellers and a maximum of 16. Departure dates and prices can be found on our website (please refer to it for the most current prices and special offers).

This tour can also be arranged privately on alternative dates for a small additional fee, with the itinerary tailored to meet your individual needs and budget. If multiple families wish to travel together on a private date, we are usually able to offer the standard group tour pricing. Please get in touch with us for further information.

4. Passports and Visas - Jordan

Passports should be valid for at least six months after your departure from the country. Please do not bring an almost full or almost expired passport. Visa arrangements are the responsibility of the traveller, and requirements are subject to change by the local authorities.

To promote tourism to the country, the Jordanian government has designed the **Jordan Pass**. This provides adults of most nationalities with a free single entry Jordan visa (for stays of 3 nights or more), a discounted package of entrance fees, and free digital brochures for the various sites in Jordan. Please check the Jordan Pass tour note for more information.

Please note that whilst the Jordan Pass is recommended for the vast majority of our Jordan Tours where entrance fees are not included, this is not recommended for our Petra & the Bedouin Trail tour as entrance fees to Petra and Wadi Rum are already included in the cost of this tour.

Double or multi entry visas for Jordan are no longer available and you will need to arrange two visas if you are doing a combination tour (eg. with Egypt and/or Israel) that visits Jordan more than once. Exceptions may occur if you are crossing to and from Israel via the King Hussein Bridge - please contact us for details.

If you wish to arrange your visa separately in advance, or if your stay will be shorter than four days/3 nights, then a visa fee of 40JD (approx. USD 57) will be due.

Families with children under 12 are recommended not to purchase the Jordan Pass for the children as entrance fees are not charged in Jordan for children under 12. Instead, the adults should purchase a Jordan Pass and we will arrange a free visa for the children which you will receive when we meet you on arrival into Amman airport.

Other nationalities may require a visa prior to arrival and to obtain this in advance, please contact your local Jordanian embassy or consulate or a visa agency for details. In addition, if you plan to enter Jordan via the southern Wadi Araba crossing (Eilat-Aqaba) or the Allenby Bridge/King Hussein border with Israel in the north, you will need to obtain your Jordan visa in advance as these are not available on arrival at the border.

5. Transport

Our trips feature a mix of different transport options. We want you to feel like you're really experiencing the country you're travelling through, but at the same time we want you to finish journeys refreshed enough to enjoy the next stage of the tour. The small distances involved in Jordan mean that we use private vehicles throughout this tour. These will be minivans, minibuses or coaches, depending on the number of travellers in the group.

The jeeps used in Wadi Rum are provided by the local Bedouins we work with, and while suitable for your desert safari, they may fall below the normal safety and quality standards for vehicles we use during the rest of our tours.

6. Transfers

Your airport transfers are included on the first and last day of the set tour itinerary, plus on any additional days if you book your hotel room with us. If you make your own arrangements for additional accommodation at either the beginning or the end of the tour then you will need to arrange your own airport transfers on these days. We will provide detailed instructions of where to meet us in the airport, along with international and local emergency contact numbers, when we send you your final tour confirmation voucher about 2 weeks before departure.

On some of our group tours we do offer an optional upgrade to a higher level of hotels. If some people in the group take this upgrade, this will mean that there may be two pick-ups and drop-offs each day. We do endeavour to ensure that all hotels used are close to each other and to streamline and time arrangements to limit any extra driving time as much as possible.

7. International Flights

We want to give you as much flexibility as possible when it comes to booking your holiday with us. So, to take account of people with varying travel plans, we don't include your international flights in the main tour price. We are however very happy to suggest flights to go with the tour. Please contact us with your preferred dates and departure airport and we'll give you a selection of airlines, times and fares to choose from.

Your airport arrival & departure transfers are included on the first and last days of the tour.

Nearly all our Jordan tours start and finish at Amman airport (AMM). Private and tailor-made tours may also start or finish in Aqaba (AQJ).

We do also sometimes advertise flight inclusive packages from selected airports. Where these are shown on our website, prices are correct at the time of quoting, but are subject to continued availability of the fare used. Prices will be reconfirmed at the time of booking, and we will also provide the flight times and airline details before tickets are issued.

Flight inclusive prices are based on the cheapest Economy ticket class available which is generally non-refundable and non-changeable unless the flight is cancelled for reasons such as Covid-19, in which case the airlines are more flexible. More flexible ticket options, as well as Premium Economy and Business Class tickets are available on request for an additional supplement. Any changes made to flight inclusive bookings will be subject to the airline rules on your ticket.

Flight CO2 Emissions:

Traveling by air is an amazing way to explore the world, but flights also contribute to carbon dioxide (CO2) emissions that impact the environment. By considering the airline's CO2 emissions when you choose your flight, you can help minimize your travel footprint.

When selecting your international flights and airline, we do therefore recommend that you try and also take into account the flight CO2 emissions. Some airlines and flight search websites (eg. Google Flights, Skyscanner) do publish this information, so you can compare between your flight options and make an informed decision. Thankfully, many airlines are working towards sustainability efforts, and choosing a greener option allows you to contribute to positive change while still enjoying your incredible adventure.

8. Group Sizes/Tour Leaders/Guides

We are dedicated to offering small group tours, as we believe this provides the best opportunity for everyone to connect with fellow travellers and fully engage with their guide. There's little value in having exceptional guides if you're struggling to see or hear them over a crowd of 30-40 people! That's why we'll never place you on a 50-seater coach with 49 other passengers and a single guide. Instead, our Jordan group departures are limited to a maximum of 18 travellers.

In Jordan, all of our sightseeing tours are led by fully trained, local English-speaking guides. Additionally, our local representatives in each town and city along the route are available to assist, ensuring all practical arrangements are taken care of for the tour.

At Egypt Uncovered, we exclusively employ local Jordanian guides and representatives, as we believe this enhances your experience of both the country and the sights you are visiting. For more details and profiles of some of our most renowned local guides, please visit our website.

For groups of up to five, we provide an escort driver along with specialist local guides at Jerash and Petra. For groups of six or more, an escort guide will accompany the group throughout the tour.

9. Tipping

Tipping for services provided is part of the local culture in Jordan, is often expected, and will be very gratefully received. While the amount you tip is subject to your satisfaction with the services provided and your personal budget, we are often asked for help and guidelines and can therefore suggest that you allow approx.:

Tour guides: US\$8-10 per person per day

Drivers: US\$3-5 per person per day

Restaurants: 10% or leave the change

Petra horse boys: US\$2-5 (we recommend against riding the horses for animal welfare and safety concerns, but the boys may still expect a tip)

10. Money - Jordan

The currency used in Jordan is the Jordanian Dinar (JD). There is no need to bring Jordanian Dinars with you as you can easily exchange currency at international airports, hotels, banks, and currency exchange offices in major cities. It is advisable to carry small denominations of notes or coins for things like using public restrooms, tipping, and small purchases. ATMs are widely available in large towns, and many local shops accept VISA, Mastercard, or Amex, although they may charge a fee of up to 10%, so it's wise to confirm this before making a payment. Traveller's cheques are no longer widely accepted and can come with high exchange fees.

During your time in Jordan, you will need to cover costs such as meals not included in the itinerary, drinks, snacks, souvenirs, and personal expenses like laundry. These are typically paid for in Jordanian Dinar, but tips for guides and drivers can be given in foreign currency such as GBP, USD, or EUR.

It's hard to give a precise figure for personal spending, as this depends on individual preferences, but as a rough guide, we recommend budgeting USD 15-25 per person per day. If you plan on shopping extensively or purchasing alcoholic drinks frequently, it's advisable to set aside more.

11. What to take

Luggage: You can bring suitcases, rucksacks, or fabric holdalls to Jordan without any issues. It's also a good idea to pack a small daypack or bag for daytime outings. Your main luggage will usually stay in the hotel while you're on sightseeing trips, so you won't need to carry it around much, and hotel porters are typically available to help.

Luggage Limits: There is no specific luggage limit for this tour. However, most airlines have weight restrictions, typically between 20kg and 25kg for checked luggage and 5kg to 10kg for hand luggage. It's best to confirm the baggage policy with your airline prior to heading to the airport.

Clothing: The weather in Jordan can vary greatly, from hot summers to cooler, sometimes rainy winters. The temperature at night, particularly in desert areas, can drop significantly, so it's important to pack for cooler conditions. There's no need for formal attire (like suits and ties). Modesty is highly valued, particularly for women, so ensure that your clothes are loose-fitting and not too revealing. Shorts (except very short ones) and T-shirts are acceptable at tourist sites, but try to avoid showing too much skin (keeping shoulders covered is recommended). When visiting mosques, both arms and legs should be covered.

Other Items: If your tour includes an overnight stay at a Bedouin camp, bedding will be provided, but we suggest bringing a light sleeping sheet or liner for extra comfort, as sand can get everywhere. In winter, or if you'd like to sleep under the stars instead of in a tent, a sleeping bag is a good idea as it can get very cold at night. It's also advisable to pack a sun hat, sunscreen, sunglasses, a basic first aid kit, toiletries, a money belt, a small torch, and your camera with its charger.

12. Voltage - Jordan

The sockets are two-pronged and provide 220 volts. Universal adapters can usually be found in most airport shops if you don't already have one. Standard European adapters will fit, though they may feel slightly loose in the sockets. All hotel rooms are equipped with electrical sockets, so you can charge cameras, phones, and other devices. Hairdryers are generally available upon request at hotel receptions, if they aren't already provided in your room. If you're bringing US appliances, you'll need both a voltage converter and a plug adapter.

13. Time

The time zone in Egypt, Jordan, Israel, and Lebanon is GMT +2 hours, while in the UAE it is GMT +3 hours. Daylight saving time has been implemented in some years but not consistently. As of now, Egypt is not expected to observe daylight saving time from 2016 onwards, although this could change unexpectedly, potentially affecting flight schedules and timings. In Jordan and Israel, daylight saving time of one hour is typically observed from the end of March to the end of October, shifting the time to GMT +3 hours. However, the exact dates vary each year, and sometimes the changes are cancelled altogether.

15. Health and Vaccinations

You should make sure you are fully covered by insurance for medical emergencies, including emergency evacuation and repatriation.

Vaccinations and other health precautions vary depending on the country you're visiting and where you're travelling from. We suggest contacting your GP or a travel clinic for the latest advice on vaccinations for your destination. You should also make sure you're up to date with the vaccinations and boosters that are recommended for everyday life at home, including those for occupational risks, lifestyle factors, and any existing medical conditions.

Additionally, the following vaccines or boosters are generally recommended for the countries in this region:

- **Egypt:** Tetanus, Typhoid, Hepatitis A
- **Jordan:** Tetanus, Hepatitis A
- **Israel:** Hepatitis A, Poliomyelitis
- **Lebanon:** Diphtheria, Hepatitis A

Malaria is generally not a risk unless contracted abroad, so you do not need to take malaria prevention medication.

Please note: We are aware that some places in Egypt may use 'black henna' instead of pure brown henna. Black henna contains a chemical dye called PPD (paraphenylenediamine), which can cause severe allergic reactions and scarring. To be safe, we recommend avoiding henna tattoos in Egypt unless you are certain they are using pure brown henna.

16. Entrance fees & Jordan Pass

The price of the majority of our Jordan tours does not include entrance fees to the sites visited on the tour (this excludes our Petra and Bedouin Trail Tour where entrance fees are included in the tour price and the Jordan Pass is not recommended):

We strongly recommend that you purchase a **Jordan Pass** prior to your travel to Jordan. This is a special package that has been designed by the Jordanian Ministry of Tourism and Antiquities for tourists visiting Jordan. As well as including a discounted package of entrance fees covering all the sites in Jordan that you will visit on this tour (plus many others), the Jordan Pass also provides free downloadable digital brochures on each attraction, plus a free tourist visa for entering the country (40JD if obtained on arrival in Jordan). It also allows us to speed up our entry to each site as if everyone has the Jordan Pass we won't need to queue for tickets.

A handful of sites that we visit on our tours are not covered by the Jordan Pass (eg. Mt. Nebo, St. George's Church at Madaba, and the Shawmuri & Azraq Reserves), so to keep things simple for you while you are in Jordan, where these are visited in our itineraries, the entry fees are included in your tour price. If you visit any other sites not covered by the Jordan Pass during your free time or on additional tours you arrange while in Jordan, you will need to pay the entrance fee at the site.

The cost for the **Jordan Wanderer Pass** which is suitable for all our tours which visit Petra on one day is JD70 (approx. US\$99). You should also check if your tour visits the Baptism Site at Bethany and if it does, add on the supplement for this site (an extra JD8, discounted from the JD12 payable at the site). Passes are available by completing a simple online form before you travel, taking care to make sure your passport details are entered correctly as this doubles as your visa application. Your Jordan Pass will then be emailed to you as a pdf

document, which you should print out and bring with you. You will then need to show this print out at the immigration desk on arrival in Jordan to obtain your free entry visa, and also at each attraction where it will be scanned to confirm your entry. [Obtain your Jordan Pass here](#)

If you do not obtain the Jordan Pass before arriving in Jordan, you will need to pay the entry fees when you arrive at each site and also pay JD40 for your Jordan visa when you enter the country (or arrange your visa in advance).

17. Entrance Fees

The tour price covers entrance fees for all tourist attractions listed in the itinerary. Any visits to sites not included in the itinerary will require you to pay the entrance fees separately.

18. Airport Transfers

This tour includes a meet-and-greet service and airport transfer on the first day. Our representative will be waiting with an Egypt Uncovered signboard or your name clearly displayed for easy identification. If you are unable to locate our representative, emergency contact numbers will be provided on your tour confirmation voucher.

A transfer to the airport is also included at the end of the tour. Please review the tour itinerary and your flight times carefully. Most international flights departing from Khartoum are scheduled in the early hours of the morning. If you have upgraded to a 4 or 5-star hotel in Khartoum, only a day-use room is typically included for your final day. A full night's stay is provided at the standard 3-star hotel. If you require a full night's accommodation in an upgraded hotel, an additional charge may apply.

Refunds are not available for missed transfers or parts of your trip due to incorrect flight details or delayed arrivals. Any additional expenses incurred to join the group will be your responsibility.

If your flights are scheduled to arrive before the tour starts or depart after the tour ends, we can arrange extra accommodation and airport transfers. We will strive to book these at the same hotel as the main tour, subject to availability (upgraded hotels can also be arranged upon request). Please note that if you do not book additional accommodation through us, arrival and departure transfer services will not be included, and you will need to organise your own transport.

Arrival Procedure

Be prepared for potential delays at immigration, especially if you are obtaining a "visa on arrival" (refer to the Passports and Visas section). After passport control, proceed to baggage reclaim, where further waiting times are common. Once you collect your luggage, you will need to show your baggage receipts (typically attached to your boarding pass), and your bags may be manually inspected by airport staff. This is standard procedure to ensure no prohibited items, such as alcohol or inappropriate materials, are brought into Sudan. Be aware that some magazines with certain images might also be considered inappropriate and could be confiscated without return.

After completing these formalities, you will find our representative waiting just outside the glass doors with an Egypt Uncovered signboard or your name clearly displayed.
